ShagowAskee is a group of indigenous elders, trappers, and knowledge keepers from Northern Alberta, Canada. A key focus is protecting the Wabasca wood buffalo – a culturally significant, genetically unique herd of endangered buffalo, also known as "ecosystem engineers" for their role in nutrient cycling, fire management, and promoting biodiversity.
